



- Design Thinking -Ideate
- · Brainstorming
- Diversity & Inclusion of Ideas

Jan 16th, 10am-Noon

Design Thinking – Ideation

- Stokes (aka icebreakers) loosen up and energize the team
- How Might We (HMW) questions are short questions that launch brainstorming
- Impose constraints with intention to increase creative potential

More Ideation Techniques

- Identify needs and understand the "job to be done" of users/customers
- Diversity is a key driver to innovation, so widen the aperture for diverse users
- Divergent thinking expands the pool of ideas and is inclusive of all ideas

- Develop HWM questions for the problem identified
- Brainstorm solutions by imposing constraints and considering diverse users
